INFORMATION CLAUSE - PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

In accordance with para. 13 and 14 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulations) (Official Gazette EU L 119 of 04.05.2016, p. 1), hereinafter "GDPR", I inform that:

- 2. In all matters related to the processing and protection of your personal data, you can contact our Inspector of Personal Data Protection, Mr. Tomasz Powała at iod@gizinscy.pl
- 3. Your personal data will be processed on the basis of para 6 (1)(c) of the GDPR for the purpose related to the public procurement procedure.
- 4. The recipients of your personal data will be persons or entities to whom the documentation of the proceedings will be made available pursuant to para 74 (3) of the Act of July 22, 2022 Public Procurement Law (Official Gazette of 2022, item 1710), hereinafter "the Public Procurement Law";
- 5. Your personal data will be stored in accordance with para 78 of the Public Procurement Law, for a period of 4 years from the date of completion of the contract award procedure, and if the duration of the contract exceeds 4 years, the storage period covers the entire duration of the contract;
- 6. The obligation to provide your personal data directly concerning you is a statutory requirement specified in the provisions of the Public Procurement Law, related to participation in a public procurement procedure; the consequences of not providing certain data result from the Public Procurement Law;
- 7. With regard to your personal data, decisions will not be made in an automated way, pursuant to para 22 of GDPR;
- 8. you have:
- based on para 15 of GDPR, the right to access your personal data
- based on para 16 of GDPR, the right to access your personal data**;
- based on para 18 of GDPR, the right to request the administrator to limit processing of personal data, subject to the cases referred to in para 18 (2) of GDPR ***;
- the right to submit a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection, if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.
- 9. You are not entitled to:
- in connection with para 17 (3)(b, d or e) of GDPR, the right to delete personal data;

- the right to transfer personal data referred to in para 20 of GDPR;
- based on para 21 of the GDPR, the right to object to the processing of personal data, because the legal basis for the processing of your personal data is para 6 (1)(c) of GDPR.
